Week nine of term two and the end of a term is filled with many exciting learning events for students and staff.

Teachers as Lifelong Learners

'Principals as Numeracy Leaders' (PANLs)

In week 8 Mrs Skinner, Mr Nicholson, Mrs Steward and Mrs Zimmer had the privilege to participate in two days of professional learning titled 'Principals as Numeracy Leaders' (PANLs), a most

fantastic learning opportunity presented by two of Australian's leading experts in the field of mathematics education, Paul Swan and David Dunstan.

The aim of the PANL project is to provide principals, deputy principals, school leaders and numeracy leaders with the knowledge and understanding of both effective leadership for learning and the content knowledge required to focus such leadership on numeracy. The three key aims of PANL are to:

1. enhance school leaders' efficacy in instructional leadership,
2. enhance school leaders' knowledge of essential numeracy content,
3. assist in the design of whole school planning for numeracy improvement, based on an initial audit of current practices and resources.

The focus of the two days was on data gathering and analysis and we learnt a lot about how to be even better lead teachers, and how to ensure we cater for the varied needs of our Evatt students.



Teacher Lead Professional Learning

Also in week 8 Kelly Pulver delivered an outstanding presentation about 'Building relationships between parents, students and the School community: The Essential Key to Delivering Better Outcomes for Indigenous Students.' One of the key messages was the eight way framework of Aboriginal Pedagogy, which comprises eight interconnected pedagogies that see teaching and learning as a holistic, non-linear, visual, kinaesthetic, social and contextualised process. Interesting and inspiring.

Susan Hammond delivered an inspiring presentation titled 'Urgency of Learning, Developing Student Motivation to Achieve Success in the Classroom. The two focus areas were quality feedback to students and systems/structures within our teaching that support student engagement.

Brent Griffiths presented a highly engaging workshop on the role of the arts curriculum in our teaching, providing a range of learning activities and how they can be modified to be used across all grades.

All three workshops were of high quality and demonstrated the dedication these three teachers have towards our students and lifelong learning.


