



From the Principal

As I write this newsletter, teachers have 99% finished their reporting process. Teachers have been so busy over the last few weeks assessing and moderating your children's work, using a range of rubrics. Rubrics are descriptors that students and teachers use to understand what they need to do to be successful. I participated in a formal observation of a lesson this week and the learning intention was clearly described and students had a clear idea of what they needed to learn and what would make their learning successful.

As parents, you may feel this is unimportant, but this is a key fact in your child's success as a learner. At Evatt, we are very articulate about what your child/ren need to do to be a learner - it is an active, cognitive, participatory action that we all engage in whether we are adults or children. That is what we do as learners whether we are 1 or 99. I am a learner.

Reports and Parent Teacher Meeting

Your child will receive their end of semester report on Friday week 9, the same day as the Athletics Carnival. Please ensure that you book an appointment to meet with your child's teacher/s in week 10. The usual electronic booking form is again going to be made live Friday 14 June and will close Friday 21 June. Details of this will be in next week's newsletter.

Communication

On a final note, may I remind all parents that as parents it is your responsibility to read our newsletter. My staff spend many hours communicating with you. I apologise to those parents who read our newsletter every week and who are amazing in your timeliness in getting your notes in on time. It is so frustrating for my staff, who are really good at communicating and use so many avenues of communication, when people complain that they didn't know that something was on. When you complain, it is, with respect, your issue, as you are not being an active participant in engaging with our communication. My teachers communicate via SeeSaw, we send you emails, we send messages on the app, paper notes are sent home with students, and uploaded to the school website. Please don't blame the school when you have not accessed these avenues. This is very upsetting for my staff.

My staff and I are SO frustrated by parents who say we do not communicate, and they didn't know about an event. Please stop criticising us, when you have not taken the time to read the newsletter or the notes that your child brings home. And please stop being angry with us when we say no to your child attending an excursion, as their note wasn't in by the due date, or that you didn't know that a school event was happening.

PLAYGROUND and SOCCER

Over the past few weeks we have noticed a decline in the school values on the playground. This has included, but is not limited to, soccer. Some of the concerns we have had is the use of inappropriate language and students being hands on whilst playing during breaks. This week Mr Niko and Mrs Skinner spoke to ALL students (Year 1-6 in a combined assembly) and Kindergarten separately to remind students of the expectations and behaviours we expect to see on the playground. All students were reminded of our expectations to ensure a safe and happy playground. As a school, we took some steps to help "break" the current pattern on the playground. They include but are not limited to:

- soccer goals being removed for a short period of time (a pause on soccer games)
- school sports buckets being distributed by sports leaders at break times to ensure there is suitable equipment to use at breaks
- due to the new sports buckets, a ban on external soccer balls coming into the school (this way we can monitor the number of games being played)
- tightening our communication strategies for passing information between teachers between breaks about potential issues on the playground.

We understand some students are disappointed by the strategies, particularly the limiting of soccer, but we as a staff feel this is necessary to ensure a safe and successful playground for all.

Chief Minister's Reading Challenge (CMRC)

As mentioned in earlier newsletter items, this term we have started the annual **Chief Minister's Reading Challenge** across the school. One of the new challenges this year is to try to read something different and expand your repertoire of books. There are 30 different topics that children are challenged to cover. One of the categories is bilingual books.

Camp 2020

The 2020 - 3/4 camp will be held in Week 2 – Term 1, Wednesday 12 – Friday 14 February 2020.

The 2020 - 5/6 camp will be held in Week 4 – Term 1, Wednesday 26 – Friday 28 February 2020.

In term 3 you will receive more information about the camp and permission notes. Medical forms will be sent home for participating students at the end of the year. At this point we are unable to give you a firm cost for the camp but most school camps cost between \$200 and \$300. Please be aware that as the camp is so early in 2020, all payments and forms must be completed before the end of the 2019 school year.

The school has made it possible to make regular incremental payments in advance during the 2019 year, to assist parents/carers to manage the cost of camp. To take advantage of this, please first visit the school office, to complete a **Payment Plan Agreement form**. It is essential that this is set up as a direct debit with your bank. A payment plan can be started at any time during the school year. Once the cost of camp has been finalised, any payments made over the amount set will be refunded. At any point during the year, if you wish to check on how much you have paid, you are welcome to enquire at the school office.

2020 Enrolments

Enrolments for the 2020 school year opened on 29 April 2019. All ACT children are guaranteed a place in their local public school for Kindergarten to year 12. However, due to growth in recent years in enrolments in the public system, some schools no longer have the capacity to take "out of area" enrolments. These schools have been identified as "Category A" schools and a list appears on the Education Directorate website.

You will not be able to seek enrolment for your child at one of these schools unless you live within the school's priority enrolment area (i.e. the school's geographic zone). All schools will, however, consider cases where there are legal issues, or exceptional circumstances based on student wellbeing. To avoid disappointment, you are encouraged to check the information on the Education Directorate's website so you can make the best decision for your family from the options available.

With winter upon us, it's important to remember that Canberra has lots of health options that don't involve a trip to a hospital emergency department. Many of these are free and available after hours.

Walk-in Centres provide free, one-off treatment of minor injury and illness, including colds and flu. They're a great choice for children over 2 years of age – children under 2 should see their GP.

Walk-in Centres are open from 7.30am to 10pm, every day of the year. They are staffed by highly skilled nurses who can provide you with a sick certificate and in some cases, medication, saving you time and money.

The service is free, and no appointments are necessary.
