Before and After School

A gentle reminder that before school we need students to be dropped off after 8.30am. This is to ensure we have staff in the building that have duty of care. From 8.40am all students and parents are to wait outside in the barnyard until the bell goes at 9am. A staff member will be on duty in this area and this is to ensure the safety of all students that are arriving to school prior to 9am. We appreciate your assistance with this.

Please remember that access into the school grounds is through the side gates. The main doors are for those needing to access the school for administrative or formal purposes. Students are to wait for their teachers at the external classroom doors. The process is the same for the end of the day with parents requested to collect their child from their class external doors; NOT to wait in the corridors, foyer or front office. We would also like to ask parents to collect their child as close to 3:00pm as possible as we have some parents regularly arriving late and others arriving as early as 2:15pm.

Safe parking behaviours

Unsafe driving and parking behaviours increase the potential road safety risk for children around schools. Road safety is a shared responsibility, it is important the road rules are followed near our school to ensure the entire school community feels safe.

Please remember children are more at risk than adults around schools because they are smaller and less visible to drivers. They are also less predictable and less experienced, which makes them more likely to make errors of judgement.

Failing to follow simple road rules like parking on the verge, in no stopping zones, in bus stops, near children's crossings, on footpaths or across driveways increases the risk to children around schools. Please do the right thing to create a safe environment around our school.







We look forward to sharing more about our learning in Kindergarten at our assembly in week 4!



Student Injury

Insurance and Ambulance Transport

The Education and Training Directorate does not provide any insurance cover for injury, disease or illness to students resulting from school activities or school-organised excursions. Claims for compensation are met where there is a legal liability to do so. Liability is not automatic and depends on the circumstances in which any injury, disease or illness was sustained.

As there is no automatic insurance cover for personal injury if your child is injured at school or during a school organised activity/excursion you should therefore consider whether taking out personal insurance cover for your child is warranted.

This insurance might cover contingencies including medical/hospital expenses, ambulance transport outside the ACT, and cancellation of transport/accommodation or loss of/damage to luggage.

The ACT Ambulance Service provides free ambulance transport for students who are injured or suddenly become ill at school or during an approved school organised activity **within the ACT**.


Calling all handy persons!


